Easington Primary seeks to ensure that all its pupils receive a full-time education which maximises opportunities for each pupil to realise his/her true potential. The school will strive to provide a welcoming, caring environment, whereby each member of the school community feels wanted and secure. All school staff will work with pupils and their families to ensure each pupil attends school regularly and punctually.

Regular attendance at school is essential to ensure uninterrupted progress and to enable our children to extend their potential. We expect all children on roll to attend every day, when the school is in session, as long as they are fit and healthy enough to do so. We believe that the most important factor in promoting good attendance is the development of positive attitudes towards school and learning.

Poor attendance can seriously affect your child's:

- attainment in school
- relationships with other children and their ability to form a lasting friendship
- confidence to attempt new work and work alongside others

Doors open at 8.35am to allow plenty of time for children to get settled for the start of lessons at 8.45am. Children are often upset if they arrive late and this can impact how they feel for the day. We want to avoid this as much as possible.

Uniform and PE Kit

Grey or black trousers, shorts, knee length skirt or pinafore.

Black school shoes only.

PE:

All children need to ensure that they have the appropriate kit in order to participate in P.E. The setting will vary and may be indoors or outdoors.

The PE Kit is:

Plain white T-shirt and plain black shorts during the warmer months.

In colder months: plain white T shirt with a plain navy or black hoodie and plain navy or black leggings or joggers (no brands/labels needed please)

Plain black or white trainers are needed for the field or the playground. (Again, no brands/labels required)

Our PE day is now Monday.

We would like the children to leave their PE kit in school all week please.

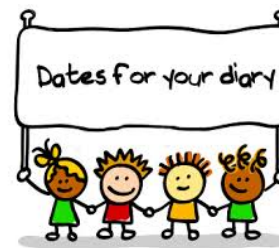
Multisports
