We believe good attendance is when children attend at least 97% of the school year. This equates to attending at least 185 of the 190 days when school is open to pupils. This is only 5 days off for the full academic year. As a school, we will only authorise term time holidays in exceptional circumstances. We monitor attendance regularly, and we will be doing so more rigorously this year. If your child's attendance drops below 90%, under Government guidelines, this means that they are classed as a 'persistent absentee' and we will write to you to invite you to discuss the reasons for this.

As parents, there is always a fine balance to consider with the cost of term time holidays and absence from school. In addition, with illness it is hard sometimes to recognise if your child is well enough to attend. Unless your child is symptomatic with an illness (e.g sickness, diarrhoea, temperature etc.) then they should be at school. If they are unwell at school, we will alert you.
