### Previous learning:

In this project the children will revisit positional and directional language, introduced in the Cycle B (Autumn Term), and identify physical features, size, location and position.

#### Sticky Knowledge

- 1. London, Edinburgh, Cardiff and Belfast are the 4 capitals of the UK.
- 2. The North Sea, Atlantic Ocean, English Channel and Irish Sea are surrounding seas and oceans of the UK.
- 3. N,S,E,W are compass points and are used to describe a location.
- 4. Human features are man made things.
- 5. Physical features are natural things.

	<ul> <li>To know that the United Kingdom is an island surrounded by the Atlantic Ocean, English Channel, Irish Sea and North Sea.</li> </ul>
Lesson 3 Geography Driver	Compass points
	<ul> <li>To know that the four cardinal points on a compass are North, South, East and West.</li> <li>To locate places within the UK using compass points.</li> </ul>
Lesson 4 Geography Driver	Human and physical features
	<ul> <li>To identify the human and physical features of the UK</li> <li>To know that human features are man-made using natural and man-made materials. People use human features in different ways</li> <li>To know that a physical feature is one that forms naturally, and can change over time due to weather and other forces.</li> </ul>
