KS1 Geography Spring Term Maps

Previous learning:

In EYFS, pupils explore a range of maps and aerial photographs. Through continuous provision, pupils are encouraged to draw simple maps as part of their play.

Pupils will revisit position and direction, which is taught in Cycle A (Autumn Term), as well as learning about aerial photographs.

Pupils will build on their knowledge of maps from Cycle A (Summer Term).

Sticky Knowledge

- 1. A map is a drawing of a place that uses lines and symbols to represent real-life objects.
- 2. A map has a 'key' to show what each line and symbol represents.
- 3. People have used maps for hundreds of years to help them travel from place to place.
- 4. There are four main compass points: North, East, South, and West.
- 5. An atlas shows maps of continents, countries, oceans and the physical features of a place.
